PETITION FOR INTERIM SUSPENSION

The Florida Bar (“the bar”) files this petition seeking the interim suspension of Nathan Samuel Williams, Attorney No. 109324, from the practice of law in Florida under Florida R. Regulating Fla. Bar 3-5.3 and states:

1. Nathan Samuel Williams (“respondent”) is a member of The Florida Bar, admitted on April 16, 2014.
2. Respondent is and, at all times the relevant conduct occurred was, a member of The Florida Bar subject to the jurisdiction and disciplinary rules of the Florida Supreme Court.
3. Respondent currently is a member in good standing.
4. On January 5, 2025, respondent was arrested on two counts of Giving or Receiving Any Drug or Controlled Substance defined in F.S.

893.02(4) to Inmate of County Detention Facility, two counts of Giving or Receiving Written or Recorded Communication from Inmate of County Detention Facility, two counts of Conspiracy to Commit the Introduction of a Controlled Substance as defined in F.S. 893.02(4) into a County Detention Facility, and two counts of Unlawful Use of Two-way Communication Device. A copy of the arrest report is attached as Exhibit A.

5. On February 13, 2025, respondent was charged with four counts of Introduction and/or Possession of Contraband into a County Detention Facility, a third-degree felony, in violation of F.S. 951.22, one count of Conspiracy to Commit the Introduction of Contraband into a County Detention Facility, a third-degree felony, in violation of F.S. 951.22 and 777.04(3), and one count of Unlawful Use of a Two-way Communications Device, a third-degree felony, in violation of F.S. 934.215. A copy of the charging document is attached as Exhibit B.

6. The above charges remain pending as of the preparation of this petition.

7. The above charges reflect adversely on respondent's fitness to practice law.

8. Respondent was released from custody pending resolution of the charges, as of the preparation of this petition.

9. The bar's Executive Director authorized filing this Petition for Interim Suspension.

The bar respectfully requests this Court issue an order under R. Regulating Fla. Bar 3-5.3 directing respondent to show cause why he should not be suspended from the practice of law until further order of the Court and setting dates for the response and any reply. The Florida Bar also seeks award of its costs under R. Regulating Fla. Bar 3-7.6(q).
