**PETITION FOR DISCIPLINARY REVOCATION WITHOUT LEAVE TO
APPLY FOR READMISSION**

COMES NOW petitioner, Gregory F. Pillon, and submits this Petition for Disciplinary Revocation pursuant to Rule Regulating Fla. Bar 3-7.12 and states:

1. Petitioner knowingly and voluntarily submits this petition without Leave to Apply for Readmission with full knowledge of its effect.
2. Petitioner is 78 years old, has been a member of The Florida Bar since September 20, 2004, and is subject to the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Florida and the Rules Regulating The Florida Bar.
3. Petitioner has the following discipline history:
 - a. In *Supreme Court Case No. SC2007-1681, The Florida Bar File No. 2007-71,319(11K)(MFC)*, respondent was felony suspended pursuant to order dated September 12, 2007 as a

result of his pleading no contest to obtaining a mortgage by false representation, a third degree felony.

b. On March 12, 2009, respondent tendered a Disbarment on Consent which was approved by the Florida Supreme Court by order dated April 2, 2009.

4. The following disciplinary charges are currently pending against the petitioner:

a. In Florida Bar Case No.: 2024-70,045 (11G), an investigation revealed that despite respondent's disciplinary disbarment, he continued to work with another lawyer as an independent contractor, without filing the required annual reports to the Bar as an employed disbarred attorney.

b. Respondent had direct client contact between December of 2022 and January 2023 with the client buyer in contravention of the Supreme Court Order dated April 2, 2009. Following the sale, he had direct contact with the non-client seller as well as the client buyer.

c. The above-listed conduct constitutes a violation of Rule 3-6.1, Employment of Certain Attorneys or Former Attorneys.

5. Petitioner contends that granting this petition will not adversely affect the public interest, the integrity of the courts, or the confidence of the public in the legal profession. Further petitioner contends that granting this petition will not hinder the administration of justice.

6. There are no allegations in this complaint that impact the Client Security Fund (CSF). Notwithstanding the same, petitioner agrees to reimburse the CSF for any and all funds CSF has paid or may pay out for claims resulting from petitioner's misconduct in this matter.

7. Petitioner agrees to reimburse The Florida Bar for the costs incurred in his disciplinary cases.

8. Bar counsel has confirmed that petitioner has no trust account. Nonetheless, petitioner agrees to submit to a complete audit of any other account(s) in which petitioner has held third party funds, if requested to do so by The Florida Bar.

9. Petitioner further agrees to submit a sworn financial affidavit to The Florida Bar attesting to petitioner's current personal and professional

financial circumstances on a form to be provided by The Florida Bar within (30) days, if requested.

10. Petitioner further agrees to maintain a current mailing address with The Florida Bar for a period of five (5) years after the disciplinary revocation becomes final. Further, petitioner shall keep the bar advised as to the physical address of petitioner's home and/or business in the event petitioner should utilize a post office box or other type of mail drop service during the five (5) year period after the disciplinary revocation becomes final.

11. Petitioner understands that the granting of this petition by the Supreme Court of Florida shall serve to dismiss all pending disciplinary cases.

WHEREFORE, petitioner respectfully requests that this Court grant this petition and order that petitioner's membership in The Florida Bar be revoked Without leave to seek readmission.
