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AMENDED PETITION FOR DISCIPLINARY REVOCATION
WITHOUT LEAVE TO APPLY FOR READMISSION

COMES NOW Petitioner, Alex S. Barnett, and submits this Amended
Petition for Disciplinary Revocation under Rule Regulating Fla. Bar 3-7.12
and states:

1. Petitioner knowingly and voluntarily submits this amended
petition without leave to reapply for readmission with full knowledge of its
effect. On January 21, 2025, Petitioner filed the original Petition for
Disciplinary Revocation Without Leave to Reapply, which was assigned
Supreme Court Case No. SC-2025-0083. The original petition cited The
Florida Bar File **No. 2025-00,046 (15G) FDR**. This amended petition is
being filed to use the new and correct Florida Bar File No. assigned to the
matter: **2025,00,289 (15G) FDR**. Otherwise, this amended petition is the
same as the original.

2. Petitioner is 34 years old and has been a member of The Florida Bar since December 21, 2018, and is subject to the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Florida and the Rules Regulating The Florida Bar.

3. Petitioner is represented in this matter by Richard A. Greenberg.

4. Petitioner's prior disciplinary history consists of the following:

a. In Supreme Court Case No. SC2023-273, The Florida Bar File No. 2023-50,185(15G) FES, petitioner was emergency suspended by Court order dated February 28, 2023.

b. In Supreme Court Case No. SC2023-0667, The Florida Bar File No. 2023-50,376(15G) FFC, petitioner was suspended by Court order dated May 11, 2023, resulting from the bar's filing of a notice of determination or judgment of guilt emanating from petitioner's nolo contendere plea to a 2nd degree felony.

5. The following disciplinary cases are currently pending against the petitioner:

a. Supreme Court Case No. SC2022-1310 (The Florida Bar File No. 2021-50,396 (15G)); Supreme Court Case No. SC2023-273 (The Florida Bar File No. 2023 50,185 (15G)FES); and Supreme Court Case No.

SC2023-0667 (The Florida Bar File No. 2023-50,376 (15G)FFC) are at referee level.

b. The Florida Bar File No. 2023-50,493 (15G) is at staff level and emanated from pending criminal charges against petitioner in Palm Beach County, Florida.

c. All of the aforementioned cases resulted from petitioner's social media posts, other communications and/or filings that contained disparaging, impugning, and/or threatening language directed at courts, attorneys and others.

6. Petitioner contends that granting this petition will not adversely affect the public interest, the integrity of the courts, or the confidence of the public in the legal profession. Further, petitioner contends that granting this petition will not hinder the administration of justice.

7. Petitioner agrees to reimburse the Client Security Fund (CSF) for any and all funds CSF has paid or may pay out for claims resulting from petitioner's misconduct.

8. Petitioner agrees to reimburse The Florida Bar for the costs incurred in his disciplinary cases.

9. Petitioner agrees to submit to a complete audit of any trust account(s) and any other account(s) in which petitioner has placed client funds, if requested to do so by The Florida Bar.

10. Petitioner further agrees to submit a sworn financial affidavit to The Florida Bar attesting to petitioner's current personal and professional financial circumstances on a form to be provided by The Florida Bar within (30) days, if requested.

11. Petitioner further agrees to maintain a current mailing address with The Florida Bar for a period of five (5) years after the disciplinary revocation becomes final. Further, petitioner shall keep the bar advised as to the physical address of petitioner's home and/or business in the event petitioner should utilize a post office box or other type of mail drop service during the five (5) year period after the disciplinary revocation becomes final.

12. Petitioner agrees to eliminate all indicia of petitioner's status as an attorney on email, social media, telephone listings, stationery, checks, business cards, office signs, or any other indicia of petitioner's status as an attorney.

13. Petitioner understands that the granting of this petition by the Supreme Court of Florida shall serve to dismiss all pending disciplinary cases.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court grant this petition and order that Petitioner's membership in The Florida Bar be revoked without leave to seek readmission.
