**PETITION FOR DISCIPLINARY REVOCATION WITH LEAVE TO APPLY
FOR READMISSION**

COMES NOW Petitioner, Jacqueline Ann O'Brien, and submits this
Petition for Disciplinary Revocation pursuant to Rule Regulating Fla. Bar 3-
7.12 and states:

1. Petitioner knowingly and voluntarily submits this petition with
leave to reapply within 5 years with full knowledge of its effect.
2. Petitioner is 42 years old and has been a member of The
Florida Bar since December 28, 2011, and is subject to the jurisdiction of
the Supreme Court of Florida and the Rules Regulating The Florida Bar.
3. Petitioner has the following discipline history: None in Florida.
4. The following disciplinary charges are currently pending at staff:

A. The Florida Bar File No.: 2024-00,235 (2A): This is a reciprocal discipline case from Ohio. Respondent entered a disciplinary resignation in lieu of discipline.

5. Petitioner contends that granting this Petition will not adversely affect the public interest, the integrity of the courts, or the confidence of the public in the legal profession. Further, Petitioner contends that granting this Petition will not hinder the administration of justice.

6. Petitioner agrees to reimburse The Florida Bar for the costs incurred in his disciplinary cases.

7. Petitioner has no trust account in Florida.

8. Petitioner further agrees to maintain a current mailing address with The Florida Bar for a period of five (5) years after the disciplinary revocation becomes final. Further, Petitioner shall keep the bar advised as to the physical address of Petitioner's home and/or business in the event Petitioner should utilize a post office box or other type of mail drop service during the five (5) year period after the disciplinary revocation becomes final.

9. Petitioner agrees to eliminate all indicia of petitioner's status as an attorney on email, social media, telephone listings, stationery, checks,

business cards, office signs or any other indicia of petitioner's status as an attorney, whatsoever.

10. Petitioner understands that the granting of this petition by the Supreme Court of Florida shall serve to dismiss all pending disciplinary cases.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court grant this Petition and order that Petitioner's membership in The Florida Bar be revoked with leave to seek readmission.
